
John wrote his gospel to convince people that Jesus is the Messiah, but his gospel also strengthens the faith of those who already know that Jesus is the Messiah.

Two-fold purpose:

- (1) Bring initial readers to saving faith in Christ
- (2) Foster the faith of disciples to continue to entrust themselves to their life in Christ.

Prominent words to reveal the theme:

"30 And truly Jesus did many other signs in the presence of His disciples, which are not written in this book, ³¹ but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God and that believing you may have life in His name." John 20:30-31



Signs (Koine Greek), when applied to a miracle, implies that the deed is an indication of some meaning behind it.

Theological considerations:


- 1. Each miracle or sign spotlights the deity of Jesus and His Messiahship to bring people to belief.
- 2. The word "believe" is used 98 times in the Gospel.
- 3. Idea: respond with complete belief trust brings life.
- 4. **Believe** in John is stressing an active and vital trust in **Jesus.** (M. Tenney: revelation, reaction, and result)

Focus point
